

# Call for Applications Mobility a. y. 2024/2025: Double Degree Programs for Master's Degree in Law, Digital Innovation and Sustainability

This call is open to Luiss students enrolled in the 1st year of the Master's Degree in Law, Digital Innovation and Sustainability during the academic year 2023/2024 and who plan to major in Climate Change in 2023/2024.

### 1. General Rules

Selected students will have the possibility to attend courses at the partner university during the mobility and have the credits recognized on their Luiss career at the end of the second year. If compliant with both universities' rules and conditions, as for credits envisaged, attendance, deadlines, academic integrity, etc., participating students will receive two degrees, which will be issued according to each university's procedures.

Selected students will spend abroad the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the Master's Degree in Management, during the a. y 2024-2025 and will be registered at Luiss during their stay at the partner university. They will not be required to pay additional tuition fees at the partner university, but they will continue paying fees to Luiss. For the DD with King's College London, selected students will be registered at Luiss during their time in London but will pay tuition fees only to the university they are attending.



All expenses related to the participation in the program, notably transport, accommodation and food, administrative expenses, costs associated with securing a visa, medical/health/accident insurance, books and personal expenses, will be borne by students. Furthermore, students must comply with all the regulations of both universities in order to obtain the two Degrees.

Selected students are required to read and understand the study plan and its rules. The study plan can be found in the webpage of each DD program (in pdf, towards the end of the webpage). Please refer to the table in page 1 of the present Call for Applications for the links to each webpage. The study plan and its rules are to be considered binding to the successful completion of the double degree program. Once selected, students are required to carefully read and sign the document "General Understanding on Mobility for Double Degrees and Structured Exchanges". Exams passed at the partner university during the mobility period will be transferred to the Luiss career according to the DD study plan. It is not possible to request an official renounce of the grades registration.

While every effort will be made to provide students with complete, accurate and timely information, Luiss reserves the right to change, amend, modify or revoke the aforementioned program. Luiss is not responsible for any cancellation or modification due to events beyond its control. If the program is cancelled or modified for these reasons, Luiss will inform all interested students in a timely manner.

#### 2. Requirements

Eligible students can apply if, within the official extraordinary Winter exam session of the a. y. 2023/2024 (4 - 21 December 2023), they comply with the following requirements for each DD they intend to apply to specified at the point 2.5 by the application deadline.

Students will be able to participate only if they are in regular time frame and have no pending administrative issues with Luiss.

#### 2.2 Weighted average grade

The weighted average grade will be calculated based on the data available to the Student Office by 19 February 2024.

### 2.3 Exams

Students are required to pass all exams taught during the 1st semester and have the relevant grades registered by 19 February 2024.



Students are strongly encouraged to pass all exams taught during the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester, ahead of the mobility year.

Please note that the Learning Innovation Activities are required to be completed by the end of the academic year 2023/2024.

#### 2.4. Language requirements

### 2.4.1 English

The language certificates cannot be older than two years from the start of the mobility (1 September 2024). Hence, we will consider as valid the English-language certificates listed at the point 2.5 that have been obtained from September 2022 onwards. Applicants must meet the requirements using a single test.

Please note that documents certifying the enrolment in the Master's Degree in Law, Digital Innovation and Sustainability are not considered as an English certificate for the present call. Only certificates listed at the point 2.5 will be accepted.

In case a Luiss student does not have an English language level issued by the Luiss Language Center (CLA) and does not hold one of the requested certificates, the student has also the possibility to take an ad hoc, free of charge test at the Accademia Linguistica Trinity School di Roma (Via dei Mille, 35) by 16 January 2024. To register, please send an email to the CLA at <a href="cla@luiss.it">cla@luiss.it</a> (please cc the International Development Office at <a href="international@luiss.it">international@luiss.it</a>) no later than 10 January 2024, at 1:00 PM. During the test the use of dictionary or other translation tools is not permitted.

During the registration process, students might opt for taking the test either in person at the Trinity School or online on the dedicated platform, with a final Skype interview for the oral assessment. Thus, students who have not a Skype account yet, are invited to create it in advance. For further information about the test and the language level as stated by Luiss please contact the CLA cla@luiss.it by January 10.

Students not eligible to take the ad hoc test mentioned above but interested in submitting a certificate issued by the Trinity School are allowed to do so but must note that this is a feepaying assessment test, which shall be reserved autonomously by the student. The test can be taken at any moment before the application deadline. The test is available also for students holding other language certificates and/or a CLA language level.

### 3. Specific Program Rules

### 3.1 DD in International & European Law and Climate Change with Tilburg University

Please note that the earliest graduation session available for students taking part in this program will be in October/November.

Special Note on application restrictions: non-EEA member state citizens will not have access to the full tuition waiver from Tilburg University. If you are applying as a non-EEA student, Tilburg will charge a € 2.209 statutory tuition fee.

#### 3.2 DD in Law, Sustainability and Climate Change with Toulouse Capitole

Please note that the earliest graduation session available for students taking part in this program will be in October/November.

In accordance with the academic regulations in place at Toulouse Capitole, students are not allowed to repeat or retake exams. Moreover, students need to have a minimum average grade of 10/20 in order to graduate at Toulouse.

### 4. Application procedure

Applications can be submitted from 8 to 26 January 2024 at 5:00 pm. In order to apply, students must complete the application form and upload the required attachments in the web self-service area of the Luiss website. Only applications accompanied by all documentation and received by the application deadline will be considered. Students are encouraged to apply well in advance of the application deadline.

In case of doubt about the documents to upload or to get further information about the requested documents, students are invited to contact the International Development Office (<a href="mailto:international@luiss.it">international@luiss.it</a>) before the application deadline.

Furthermore, students that might require compensatory tools or dispensatory measures during the mobility are invited to get in contact with the International Development Office at <a href="international@luiss.it">international@luiss.it</a> before applying to the program, in order to get more information on the special provisions guaranteed in the selected destinations.

### 4.1 Compatibility with other International Programs

### 4.1.1. Compatibility among the DD Programs

Eligible students are allowed to apply to both DD Programs included in this Call for Applications and will rank the programs according to their preferences at the moment of application. Please note that this preference is completely binding and cannot be changed after the application has been correctly submitted.



Students will be selected for only one DD within their list of preferences and will be removed from the selection procedures of the other DD program.

Students who are not selected for any DD can remain in the waiting list of more than one DD. If they are recalled from the waiting list of any program (regardless of their preference) and they confirm their participation, they will be subsequently removed from the other waiting lists.

Refusal or missing confirmation of the DD selection implies the official withdrawal from all the DD programs in this call.

#### 4.2 Compatibility with the International Student Exchange programs

Eligible students are allowed to apply to these programs and the International Student Exchange program.

Students applying to both Calls who will be selected for a DD must confirm their participation to the DD within the established deadline as detailed in paragraph "8. Acceptance".

If selected students confirm their participation to the DD, they will be automatically excluded from the selection for the International Student Exchange program and will be removed from the candidates list.

If selected students do not confirm their participation to the DD according to the rules explained in paragraph "8. Acceptance", they will remain eligible for the International Student Exchange program.

### 4.3 Attachments requested in the application

Please note that the application must be completed through the web self-service. You are required to follow the instructions on the program webpage.

To be considered, the attachments must be in English and in PDF, readable, scanned (not photographed), named as follows:

### 4.3.1 List of the Attachments:

- 1. English Language Certificate.
- 2. Curriculum Vitae (in English).



- 3. ID Card or Passport, depending on the entry requirement for the selected destination<sup>10</sup>.
- 4. A motivation letter in English using the template provided by the International Development Office. The template can be found in the "useful documents" section of every program web page.

The document is prepared in the form of guidelines, considering the specific content required for selection. You are required to state the reasons for applying to the programme for each desired destination. Once completed, the motivational letter must be uploaded on Web Self Service as a pdf file.

- 5. Bachelor's Degree diploma, including the final grade
- 7. Transcript of records in English of Master's Degree in English
- 8. Certificate of internship/traineeship abroad (if applicable; must state the duration of the internship, where it was done and tasks covered).
- 9. Other certificates (optional).

#### 6. Selection

Eligible candidates will be ranked after the assessment of their academic performance and other relevant criteria, as reported in the table below. The academic performance will be calculated on the data available to the Student Office by 19 February 2024. Candidates are responsible to check its accuracy in due time.

#### 6.2 International experience

Only one international experience will be taken into consideration for the academic performance score purposes. The international experience will be assessed through the following documents:

- Transcript of Records of the exams taken abroad or a certificate issued by the host University concerning the study experience abroad;
- Certificate of internship/traineeship abroad, registered by a University Career Service, for at least 150 hours. Certificates other than those officially registered by the University Career Service might be submitted to the International Development Office, who reserves the right to consider them.

### 6.3 Bachelor's Degree final grade

Regarding the Bachelor's Degree final grade, the score will be calculated proportionally to the final grade, from a minimum grade of 100/110 up to a maximum of 110 cum laude.

### 6.4 Ex aequo

In case of ex aequo, curriculum vitae, personal statement, and knowledge of other languages will be considered. The students may be requested to send documents proving their experiences as declared in the CV.

### 7. Communication of results

In compliance with current provisions on personal data protection, rankings will not be published. Students will be informed of the result of their own application only. Information such as other candidates' position in the ranking will not be disclosed. Selected students will receive the communication via-email by 26 February, 2024 (date may be subject to change) on



their Luiss student e-mail account. Thus, students are strongly invited to check their Luiss email account every day while the selections are ongoing.

Please note that once the student is selected for the Double Degree, the student will be responsible for enrolling in the applicable major.

#### 8. Acceptance

Selected students will be required to confirm their acceptance through written notification within one working day from the notification of results.

In case of refusal or missing notification by the deadline, the following candidate in the waiting list will be recalled. Recalled students will be required to confirm their participation by written notice within one working day.

Every refusal received after the established deadline will be transferred to the Deputy Rector for Master's Degrees Programs who will evaluate its motivations with the Dean of the Graduate School and the Director of Academic Services & Global Learning, and will inform the Graduation Commission of those refusals deemed not properly motivated.

### 9. Additional points

The participation and successful completion of a DD program will provide additional points to the Final Grade of the Master's Degree, according to <u>Luiss rules</u>.
