### Important Rules

- This study plan is designed for students taking part in the mentioned Double Degree Program and spending the academic year 2023/2024 at King's College London.
- Interested students are required to read and understand the study plan and its rules. These are to be considered binding to the successful completion of the double degree program. Changes to the study plan are usually not possible and any request in this sense must be conveyed to the International Development Office, that cannot guarantee its feasibility.



- The list of courses to be taken abroad may be subject to changes should the academic offer at King's College London be amended.
- The listed exams must be taken and passed in the academic year indicated in the scheme (not after). Any possible change must be formally authorized by the Academic Commission.
- During the mobility, students will be subject to the rules of King's College London.
- At the moment of application, students must choose the specialization for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year at King's College London (International Management, or Human Resource Management and Organizational Analysis). Please note that this preference is completely binding and cannot be changed.
- At the end of the program, if compliant with both Luiss and King's College London academic requirements, students will obtain both the International Management MSc or the HR Management and Organizational Analysis MSc (issued by King's College London) and the Master's Degree in Management (issued by Luiss).

## Thesis

- Students will complete their theses during their mobility period at King's College London (2023/2024), with two supervisors, one from each university. However, no interaction between the two supervision processes is to be expected.
- Students must respect the thesis procedures and deadlines from both institutions. Each institution will grade the final thesis according to its own standards.
- Each supervisor has to approve the proposal specific to that supervisor's institution, with the proposals also being two different products that must meet the standards of the respective institutions.
- Students are reminded that they are required to comply with the Luiss regular procedure regarding the thesis assignment, registration for the degree exam and upload of the thesis. For further information, please check the [following page](#).
- Students will be graded on their theses at King's College London at the end of the second year in August and defend orally in Rome in October / November. Please note that the July graduation session is not available for Luiss students taking part in this program.
